Shawn was finding that the opportunities in his field were further narrowed by the fact that most employers wanted potential employees to have their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, a clean criminal record, and the jobs were physically demanding. 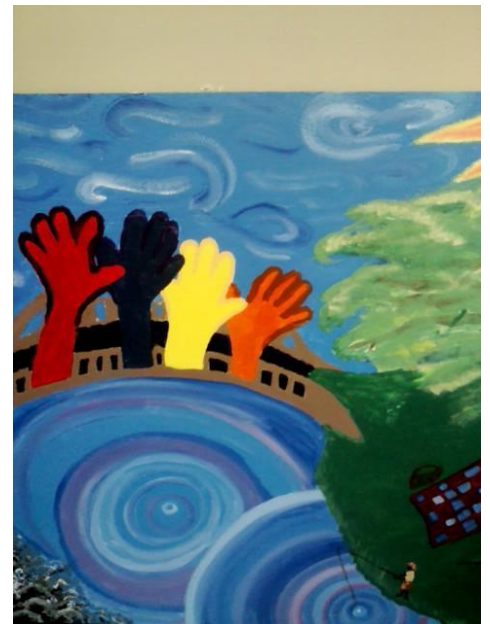
The Art of Working Through Addiction Challenges

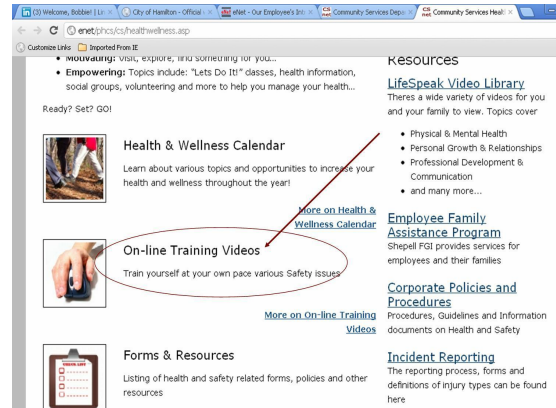
